

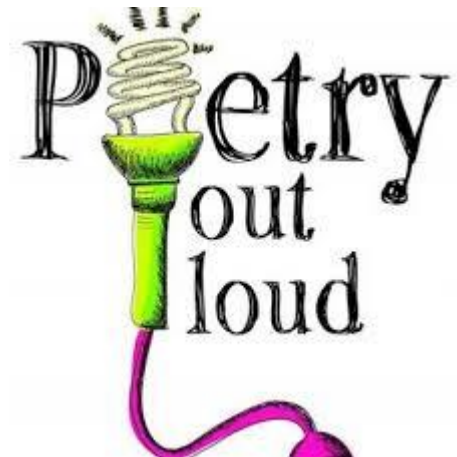
English 11

- How you can become a better reader and writer?

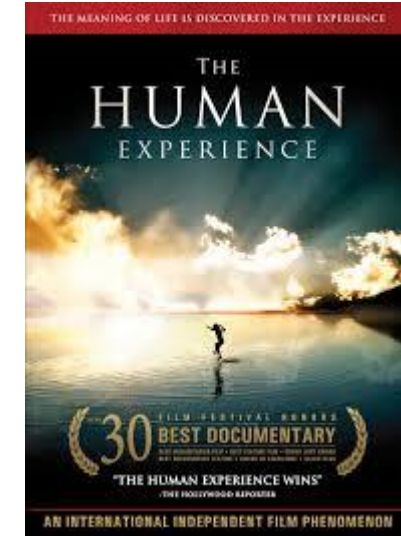
We will explore these questions and more in English 11 this year.
