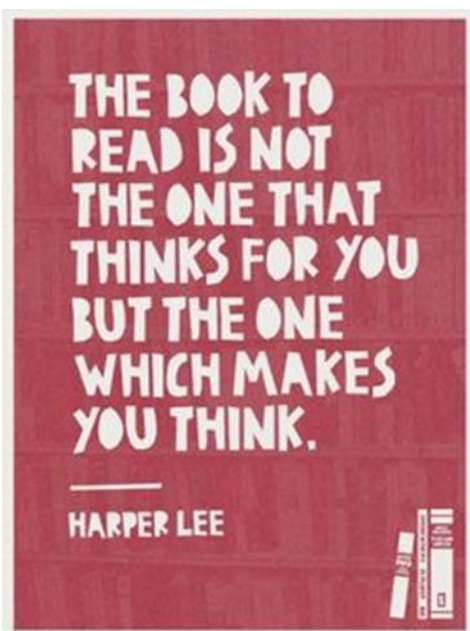

Hamlet, *The Awakening*, a full-length play of literary merit, a full length novel of literary merit



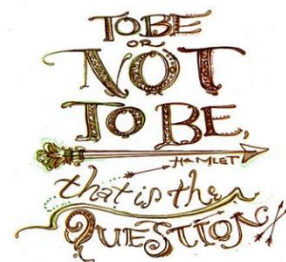
Materials:
